

# **COMMUNITY PARTNER SPOTLIGHT: Mediation Center of the Pacific**

Have you ever felt frustrated when you have a disagreement with someone? Have you wished you could get help talking to that person so you could find a solution? The Mediation Center of the Pacific (MCP) can help! A local non-profit that has been serving Oahu's communities since 1979, MCP helps families, businesses, and individuals talk and resolve their differences through a process called mediation. Mediation brings people together with mediators, impartial people trained to assist, to resolve their conflicts.

While mediation can help almost any type of conflict, MCP's Kupuna Pono program is designed especially for families with an elder family member. Kupuna Pono helps the kupuna talk about sensitive issues in a family conference and work with their family to create a plan for aging well and end-of-life that supports their wishes, needs, and values. MCP works with the family before the family conference to create an agenda that addresses current and future concerns. During the family conference, facilitators guide the conversation between all family members and take notes of what was discussed and what was decided to do. All participants receive a printed family plan after the conference. If you are interested in organizing a family conference, **call (808) 521-6767** to talk to a MCP Client Services Specialist.
